



Position: Woonasquatucket River Greenway – River Ranger

The Woonasquatucket River Watershed Council (WRWC) is seeking highly motivated individuals who live near the Woonasquatucket River Greenway in Providence or Johnston to join our Ranger team. Rangers will assist with the maintenance of the parks and bike path along Woonasquatucket River Greenway.

Daily tasks may include mowing, weed whacking, brush cutting, spot weeding, mulching, picking up litter, watering plants, sweeping, raking, river clean ups, tree pruning, fence repair, working with volunteers, and graffiti removal. River Rangers are stewards of The Greenway and are responsible for greeting people in the community and encouraging appropriate use of the outdoor space.

Required Qualifications:

- Be 18+ years old;
- Be highly motivated and comfortable working with a diverse group of people;
- Be able to work in the heat, doing hard, manual labor;
- Complete the 2 page River Ranger Application (attached).

Preferred Qualifications:

- Bilingual Spanish Speaking;
- Live in a neighborhood along the Greenway, such as Valley, Olneyville, Harford, Smith Hill, and Johnston or have reliable transportation.

About WRWC: The Woonasquatucket River Greenway is a 7-mile bike path that follows the river on road and off-road from Providence to Johnston. The WRWC has worked to restore four urban parks along the Greenway – Cricket Field, Merino Park, Donigian Park and Riverside Park. The River Ranger team will work with the Police Department, Providence and Johnston Parks Department, the Providence Housing Authority, local organizations, businesses, churches, recreation centers, and community members to revitalize the parks, maintain the bike path, and educate and empower the watershed community.

The WRWC is a non- profit organization whose mission is to encourage support and promote the restoration and preservation of the watershed as an environmental, recreational, cultural and economic asset of the State of RI.
